Message from the Chair of Governors and Acting Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all enjoyed a relaxing half term break.

Sadly, since our last newsletter, we have all seen the upsetting images and videos in the media and on social media of the Palestinian/ Israeli Conflict. We are aware that this has caused upset and concern from within the whole school community which has made it a difficult time for many.

We are writing to inform you about how the school is responding to the current situation and supporting the children when they raise any questions.

As a school, we are an apolitical organisation, meaning that adults will not share their personal thoughts or opinions on the conflict. Any response to the children will be balanced, compassionate and educational. As a school we promote tolerance, equality and inclusion. We are here to support the children's understanding, including their awareness of differences of view.

In school, the conflict has been discussed through Assemblies with the Key Stage 2 children and in their classes when they may raise specific questions or concerns. The conflict has not been raised specifically with the EYFS and Key Stage 1 children, but if they do ask any questions these will be addressed in class by their teachers.

Our key messages from the school are:

- * Our thoughts are with all those who have lost lives or been injured and with their families;
- * We are concerned about the violence in Palestine and Israel and our thoughts are with all those who have been made to feel unsafe in their own homes, wherever they are;
- * We hope for peace and an early resolution to the conflict;
- * We remain a place of calm; we care for each other and will show tolerance and understanding;
- *We have the shared belief in supporting the rights of every pupil and their families to live without fear of any form of discrimination or hate within our local community.

One thing to consider is that different birds like to feed in different ways. Birds such as House Sparrows are generally ground feeders, preferring to

hop around on the ground and finches generally prefer to feed from hanging feeders.
