Next year's RHE (Relationships and Health Education)

As you are aware, Relationships Education becomes statutory from September. We are currently working our school policy and syllabus in line with LA guidance. As you may be aware, the Local Authority will be holding 'Wave 1' parent consultations at the end of June, once lockdown has lifted. However, our school leaders and governors have decided to begin an initial consultation process a little earlier. By the middle of May, we will share our draft RHE policy and syllabus and provide an opportunity for parents to feed their views back to us electronically. The next step will be the Local Authority 'Wave 1' parent consultations at the end of June. After this, Barley Lane will carry out our 'Wave 2' parent consultations where further parent views will be considered. The Wave 1 and Wave 2 timelines are dependent on government lockdown restrictions being eased. We hope that this approach will allow the community to help us to design our RHE curriculum for the benefit of the children in line with statutory requirements.
